

- Science and trust need to work together for future pandemics




- Speaker: Dr Sundar Sarukkai
- **Topic:** The moral crisis of public health
- The talk provided a broad overview on the moral and ethical challenges in dealing with the concept of public health during the Covid-19 pandemic with a special focus on the nature of the term "public" in "public health itself.
- Public Health is political by nature and "questions of morality and ethics in public health are not a set of epistemological claims but are political processes."
