Marjolein Pijnappels is the first Dutch futures ecologist. She interweaves the wisdom of nature with emerging technologies to reimagine our futures. In 2022 Marjolein initiated Birth Futures, a speculative program dedicated to reimagining birth care through innovative design and social dreaming. With researchers and midwives from the Critical Midwifery Studies Collective, she weaved together dreams for better birth by midwives, young parents, and healthcare professionals from diverse communities in India, Peru, and the Netherlands. The goal is to foster dialogue and collaboration across geographies and time to explore holistic, inclusive futures for birth. Marjolein's method for reimagining futures called Futures Ecologies has been recognised in the Dutch national manual Futures Thinking by Rijksbouwmeester.

Amritha R. Warrier is an AI animator and media ecologist based in Berlin with a decade of experience. Beginning her journey by drawing frames on paper with ink on a lightbox, she went on to explore diverse animation techniques, blending 2D, 3D, and hand-drawn elements, sometimes incorporating VR, AR, and AI. Inspired by personal experiences and studies in Media theory and 20th-century philosophy, she now works as an AI consultant at Scale AI, collaborating with clients like Google and OpenAI, and independently on a range of other creative projects.
